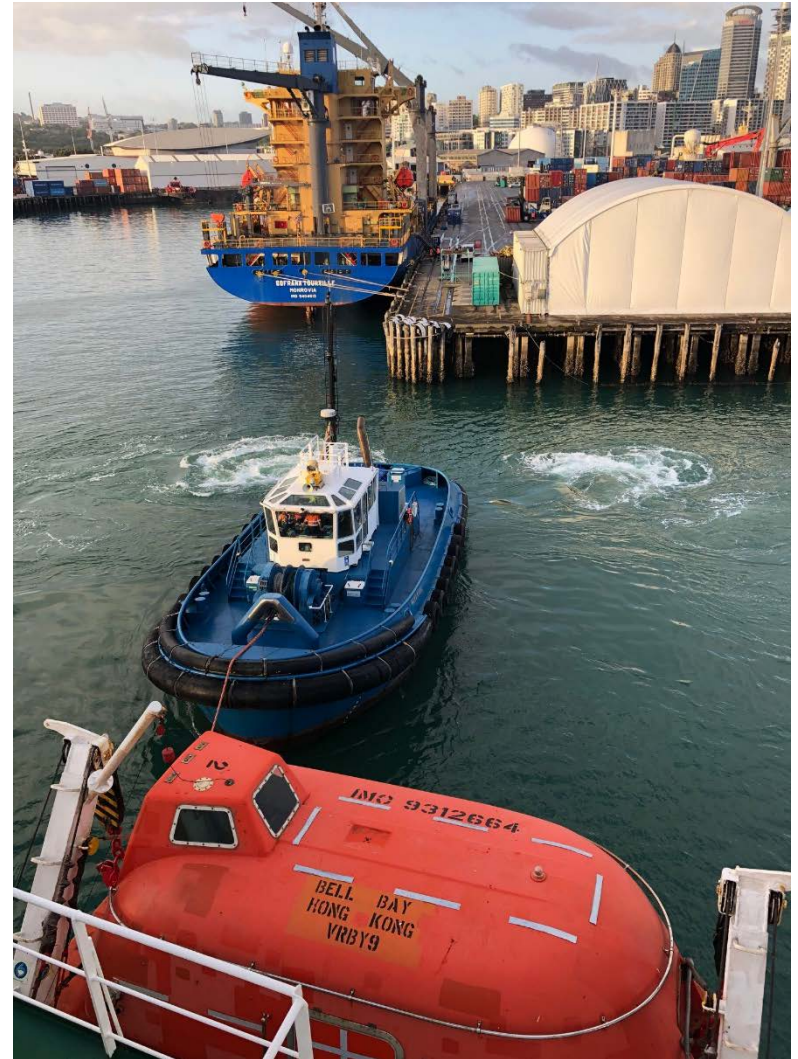

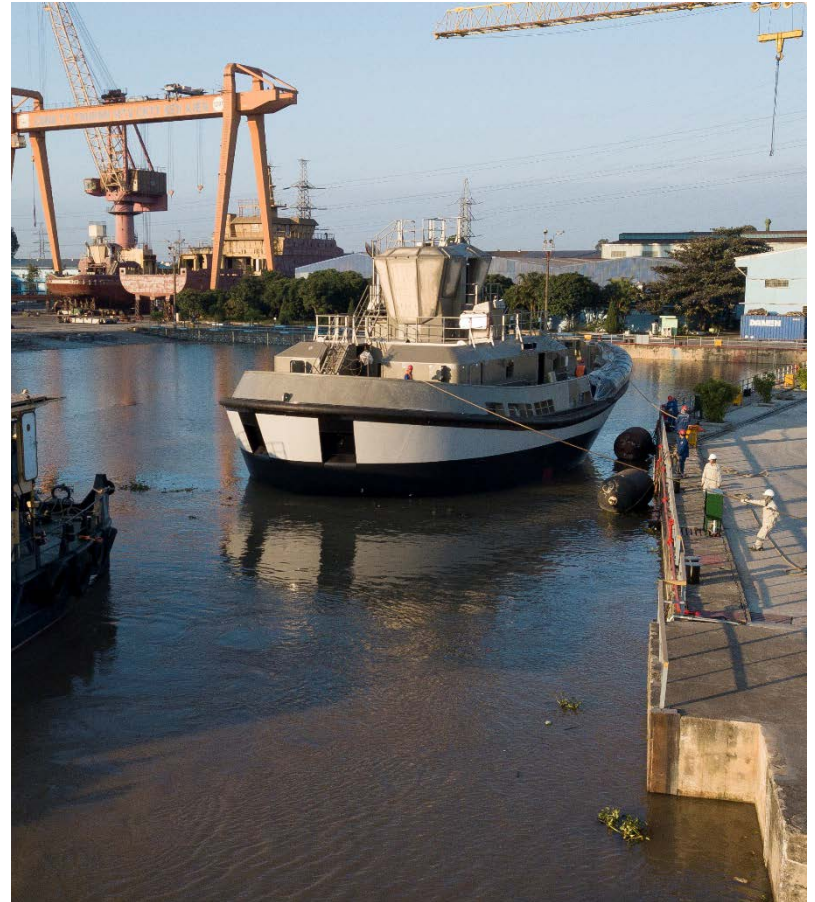
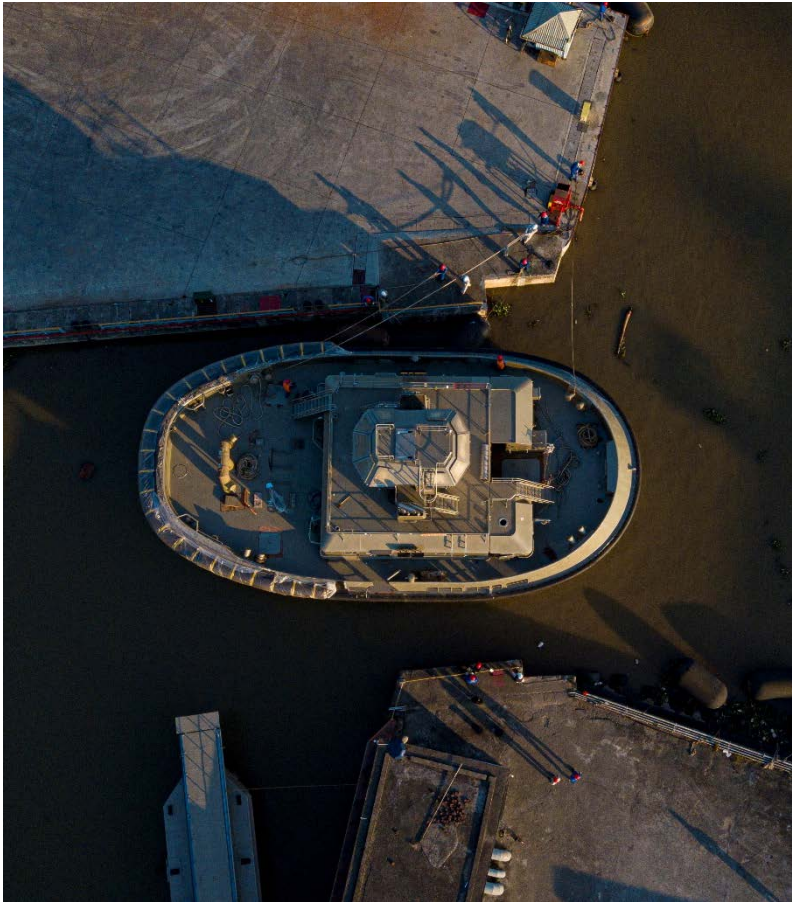
COVID-19

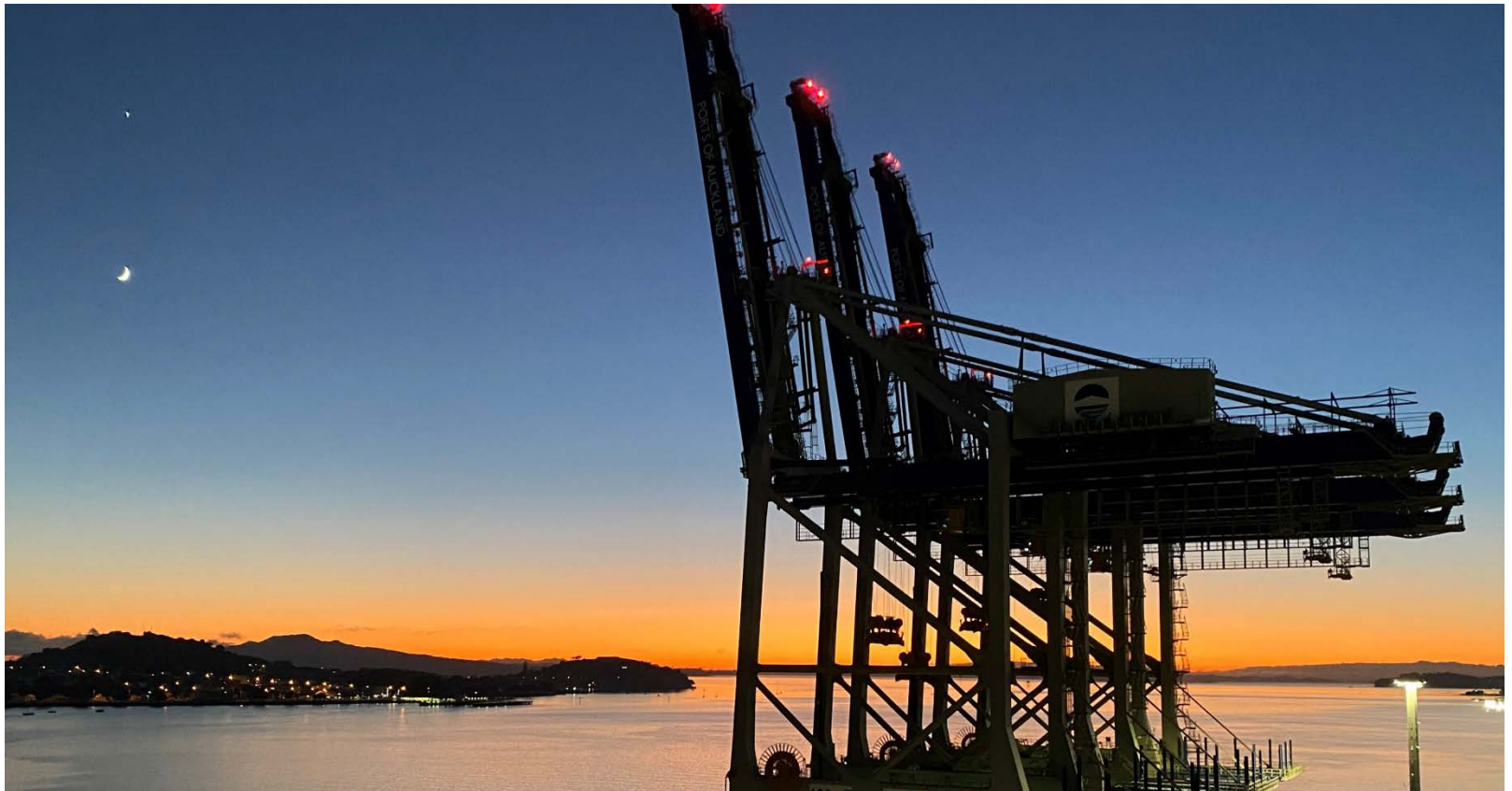

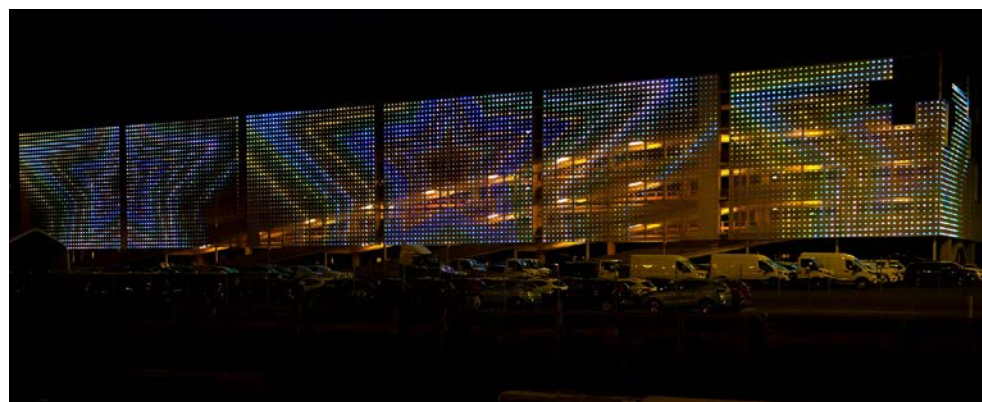


The Lightship

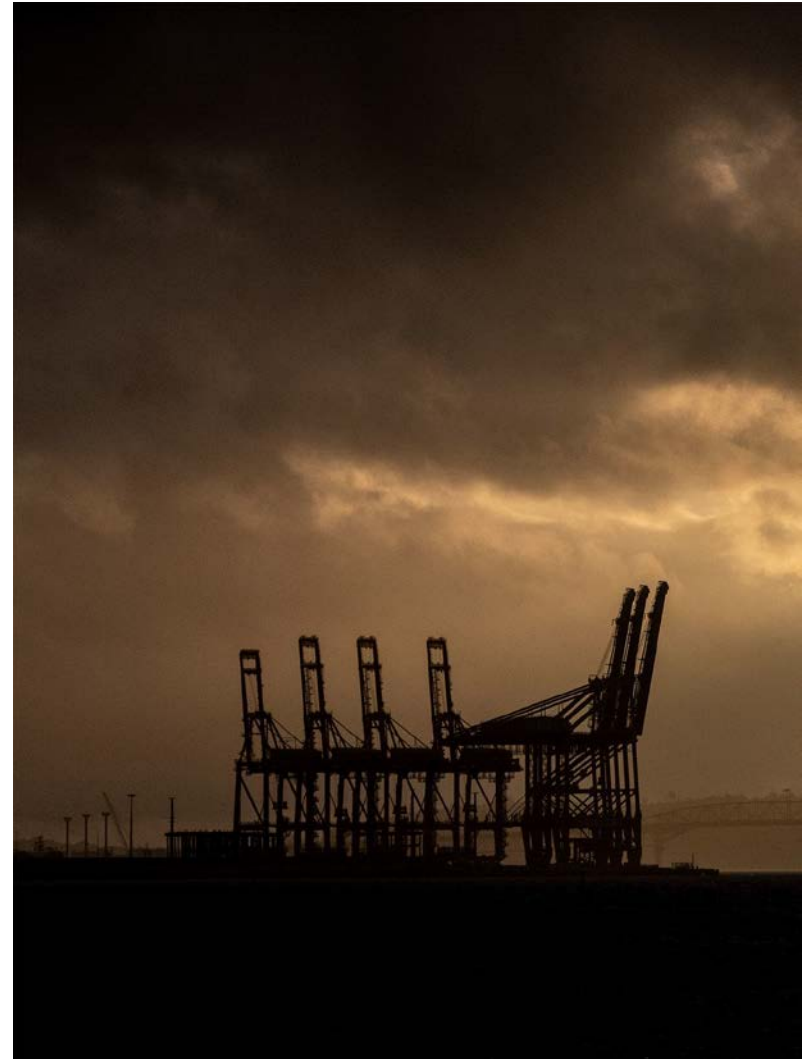

At this stage, our new model confirms we comply with Auckland Unitary Plan limits.

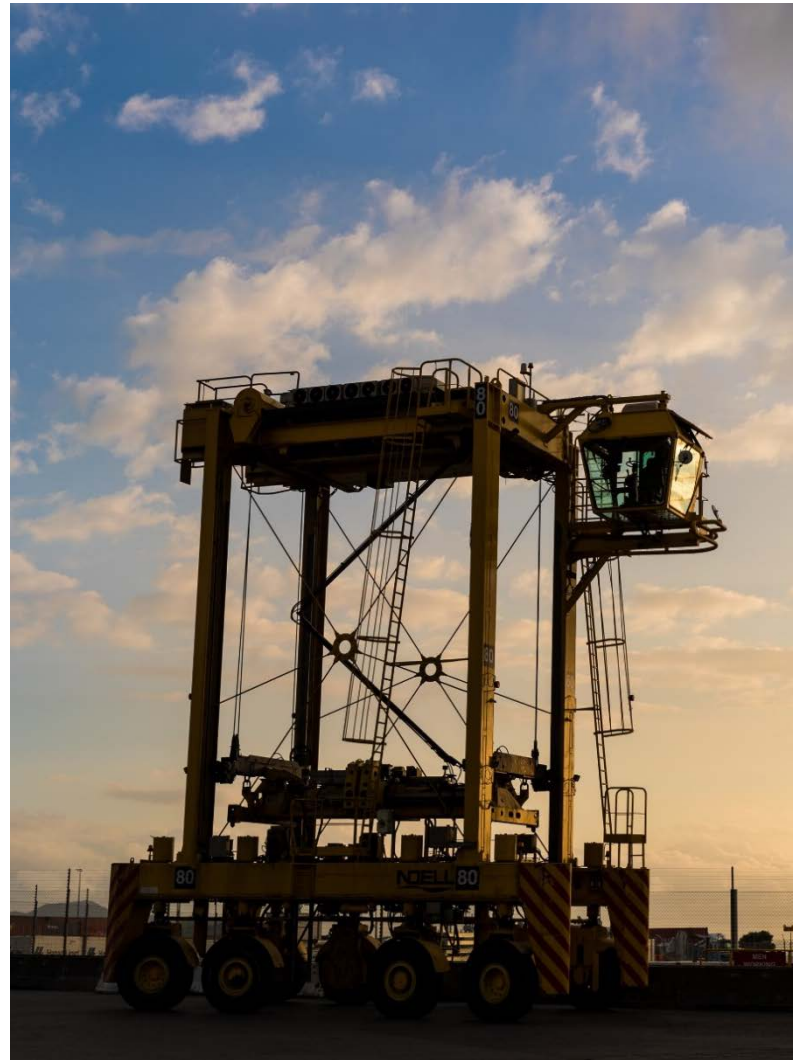
Final community monitoring to validate these findings to be made soon once night operations resume normal levels.



Air Quality

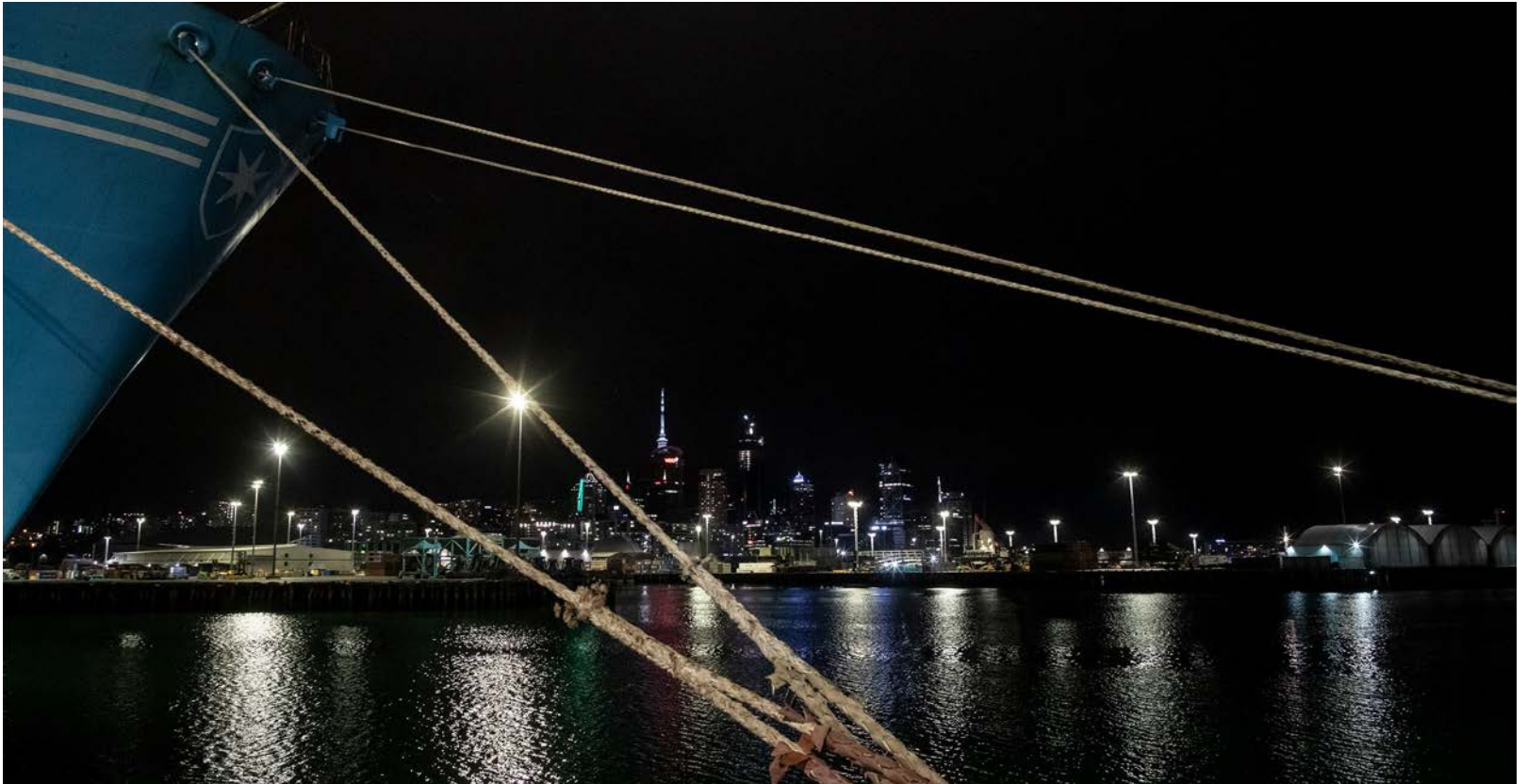
