

Operational Update

28 September 2022

Overall Operational status

Key points: Container terminal yard utilisation is at 88% today.

Terminal operations running well however labour capacity remains tight due to absenteeism and with ongoing back-to-back vessel demand, high import and export volumes vessel delays are averaging a few days, between arrival at anchorage and berthing.

Some additional callers over the next few weeks also evacuating empty containers.

Several services now operating to fixed berth windows, Pacifica and Maersk Coastal service and ANL Tranztas service. Please continue to monitor vessel schedules on www.poal.co.nz.

Shipping

We are maximising the working of vessels with minimal berthing delays at anchorage. There are some large container exchange vessels due over the coming days.

Link/On-dock Empty Container Depot – Link facility is at 79% utilisation.

Road Services – Running well. Average turn times are 21 minutes. In the last 48 hours 749 import containers left the terminal via road and 243 left via rail.

Due to low demand for VBS bookings, Fergusson Container Terminal R&D will have **kiosk only operation** from 1900 Saturday to 0700 Sunday.

For companies running empties into Link please ask your drivers to use both entry lanes to avoid queues forming out onto Tamaki Drive.

Rail Services – Ports of Auckland rail operations are running as expected with some service cancellations during the week due to rail labour shortages.

Multi-cargo (MC) Operations

Berth and Yard Capacity – Container/Bulk berths currently at approx. 70%, with the yard increasing utilisation towards the end of this week.

Est. Berth times for incoming vessels - Ops being planned with caution and yard space heavily reliant on Transporter deliveries being conducted promptly.

For PCC Car volumes currently at 40% however with multiple vessels inbound from now and into next week capacity will increase to 100%.

As noted above, congestion expected to continue with further large volumes. MC remains under pressure, so we encourage carriers to liaise with shipping lines on receivals and operating hours.

POAL/MC Ops team request all efforts for key stakeholders to resource for the swift delivery of cargo within its permitted free time. Extensions for free time and additional storage will not be considered.

Road Services – Container and Breakbulk R&D is well controlled. The Multi-Cargo truck grid may be congested during busy periods and is being managed accordingly.

R&D service issues must be directed to the Shipping Line and their nominated stevedore directly keeping our MC team in copy.

Vehicle Transporters are encouraged to communicate with Multi Cargo Ops for staging areas and any subsequent issues.

Additional reminder to all drivers: you must drive and operate to the weather conditions and adhere to the road markings/signs.
